

North Coast Inland Trail



The North Coast Inland Trail is one of our most unique parks, because it is actually a 28-mile-long path. This multi-use trail was built in three sections. The first section, 8.5 miles between Fremont and Clyde, was opened on September 28, 1997. The second section is 10.5 miles long and connects Fremont, Lindsey, and Elmore. It was opened on October 12, 2008. The third section is 5 miles long and connects Clyde to Bellevue, and was opened October of 2012.

There are many bridges, benches, and shelters along the North Coast Inland Trail. Access points to the trail include Walter Ave., the Clyde gazebo, Roger Young Park, Walsh Park, downtown Lindsey, and the Tea Kaufman Homestead. A spur of the trail was added in 2023 to connect Terra State Community College to State St.

The trail is open year-round for walking, running, biking, and in-line skating. The snow plowing, leaf-blowing, and tree trimming is done by the park district operations staff. The Sandusky County portion of the North Coast Inland Trail serves as a section of The Buckeye Trail.
